#### 1. REGENERATING OURSELVES AND OUR HABITATS

##### *a. Living income*

- **Farmer price floors** (parity pricing) and/or farmer-owned reserves: Work with food-and-farm coalitions to reinstate.

**d. A “Leopold Center” in every state:** Create center for “food, agriculture, and sustainability” committed to collaborative research in the biophysical sciences and social sciences equally and integrated with the arts. Create and maintain strong public connections with people and communities all over each state.

##### *a. U.S. FOOD & FARM SYSTEMS: Visioning for Sustainable and Democratic Production*

##### *b. PUBLIC MONEY: Restore U.S. money creation to a public authority through the NEED Act of 2012*

— Federal Reserve: Nationalize

— U.S. Money: Define and create

— Citizen dividend: Immediate funds for every citizen (approx. \$10,000 each)

— Infrastructure projects. Create \$XXX in new U.S. Money for regenerative infrastructure: civil engineering, food-and-farm, public education, student debt, civic engagement, etc. At least 25% to be allocated at the state and local levels.

— Fractional reserve lending: Outlaw for commercial banks

##### *c. U.S. CONSTITUTION and IROQUOIS CONSTITUTION* (Great Law of Peace)

National book club to study the U.S. Constitution in comparison to the original model, the Iroquois Constitution, especially in relation to specific structures of the Iroquois League:

*Bicameral self-governance for 500+ years:* women’s councils + men’s councils

— 100% inclusion: all adults

— Living document (ease of amendment): 5-year sunset clause

Women’s councils: Set agenda for men’s councils

— Appoint and remove chiefs

— Initiate and end war

*Economic structures*

— Funded sovereignty: citizen income

— Reciprocal economics: gift economy (absence of “bullyboy” economics)

— Distribution hubs: clan mothers

*Social structures:* Full personal liberty for all

— Legal identity, record-keeping: clan mothers

## STATE OF ILLINOIS

[Illinois Food, Farms, and Jobs Plan](#) (2009)

Implement the three Goals for 2020 with special attention to the strategies listed.

### Goals for 2020

- 1. INSTITUTIONAL PROCUREMENT.** Coordinate state institution food procurement policies to increase purchase of Illinois local farm and food products at state-funded cafeteria to 20% of total purchases.
- 2. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.** Support and expand programs that recruit, train, and provide technical assistance to 20,000 Illinois residents (5,000 farmers, 12,500 farm laborers, and 2,500 infrastructure entrepreneurs) to produce, process, and distribute Illinois local food and farm products.
- 3. CONSUMER PURCHASE.** Increase the purchase of Illinois local food products by Illinois consumers to 10% of total food dollar expenditures.

### Strategies for 2018-2020

- a. Farm-to-school:** Add 3-part model to core Illinois curriculum (early childhood, K-12)
  - Healthy, local foods served in schools and available to parents who pack lunches
  - School garden or farm: living skills, hands-on skills
  - School curriculum includes or is modeled on the food-and-farm system
- b. Soil building and restoration**

Collect and return all food scraps and yard waste to Illinois soils via composting.

- c. Fair Food-and-Farm Income**
  - Valued workforce (production, consumption, waste mgmt.): Develop Illinois [Good Food Purchasing](#) label

- d. Promote productions of oats** and other small grains (barley, wheat, triticale, heirloom corn, etc.)

  - Non-food products: ornamental plants, soil amendments, forestry, renewable energy, etc.
- f. Agri-tourism: Exchange visits across Illinois**

Organize and promote statewide community and leadership exchanges to foster understanding of food-and-farm assets, cultures, and technologies in different parts of the state (north-south, rural-urban-suburban, etc.), including non-food products (nurseries, forestry, soil amendments, wind farms, beauty, etc.)
- g. Moratorium on CAFOs** (confined animal feeding operations)
